

DEMOTTE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL CORPORATION

Date Approved: May 24, 2022

Funded By: Jasper County Community Fund

Grant Amount: \$5.000

FLAG PROJECT IN MEMORY OF RICK HARPER

REMINGTON MAIN STREET

Date Approved: May 12, 2022

Funded By: Community Support Fund - Jasper

Grant Amount: \$1,850

Grant Purpose: To honor a resident who passed in 2021, several flags were placed in downtown Remington. This project was a community effort made possible by donations and contributions from citizens. Rick Harper, 65, passed away on Tuesday, August 31, 2021. He was the son of Rich and Helen Harper, born on January 9, 1956 in Harrison, Ohio. The family moved to Remington in 1959 where he lived his entire life. He graduated from Tri-County High School in 1974. He married Barb (Skelton) on April 11, 1981 at the Wolcott Christian Church. Together they raised two daughters Katie and Rachel. He worked at Dekalb Seed for a number of years. He then continued to farm with several local farmers. Rick loved to cook, enjoyed reading, and was a loyal fan of NASCAR. Rick was a lifelong farmer who could always tell you how much rain we got. He was an avid gardener, enjoyed sitting around the campfire, and loved being a Grandpa. The flags are a fitting tribute to his memory that will be enjoyed for years to come.



PRECISION AG CLASS RESOURCES

TRI-COUNTY JUNIOR SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Date Approved: May 24, 2022

Funded By: Grace Pampel Educational Impact Grant

Grant Amount: \$10,800

Grant Purpose: Thanks to the Jasper Newton Foundation, Tri-County students have access to drone technology to learn about the benefits and impact of precision agriculture. Eighteen students are enrolled in two dual credit courses in Precision Agriculture and UAVs with Ivy Tech Community College-Lafayette. Resources for the class allowed 19 students to learn how to operate unmanned aerial vehicles (drones). With training and preparation, five out of seven students were able to pass the drone certification exam on the first attempt. As licensed drone operators, these students are very employable in several agriculture industries in our community. Mr. Scherer, the Tri-County Ag teacher, completed the training in the precision agriculture curriculum and has access to the Purdue curriculum, which has empowered students to develop more skills that will assist them in the technical aspects of the agricultural industry.



RCHS WELDING

RCHS WELDING DEPARTMENT

Date Approved: May 24, 2022

Funded By: Grace Pampel Educational Impact Grant

Grant Amount: \$25,000

Grant Purpose: With this grant, five new multiprocess Miller welding machines have been purchased. These machines allow students to train in various welding processes and gain real welding experience. With the additional equipment that was purchased, the RCHS welding program is now able to accommodate 15 students per class.

Classes are lab-based and hands-on, allowing the students to gain hands-on employable skills. Many students who finish the program continue pursuing a career in the welding industry, whether that be with a local manufacturer or continuing their training with a trade school or apprenticeship.



MATCHING GRANT FOR WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

Grant Amount: \$1.005

Grant Purpose: Thank you Jasper Newton Foundation for supporting Wreaths Across America by sponsoring Veterans Wreaths through the General Van Rensselaer Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution. MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS CONVOCATIONS FOR LOCAL **HIGH SCHOOLS**

Funded By: Grace Pampel Education Fund

Grant Amount: \$12,500

Grant Purpose: This project began with the Jasper County Parr Panthers 4-H Club. For their YES Grant Community Service Project, the club wanted to promote mental health awareness in their community. Through a partnership with the Jasper Newton Foundation, the club was able to expand to Newton County as well. With a grant from the Grace Pampel Education Fund, the club was able to bring in Jeff Yalden, an author, veteran, and motivational mental health speaker, to speak at Rensselaer Central High School, South Newton High School, and Kankakee Valley High School. Jeff Yalden was in the area for two full days and gave four presentations, including an event for parents and community members. His message reached about two thousand students. The funds received from this grant helped the Jasper County Parr Panthers 4-H Club accomplish their goals of raising the level of mental health literacy and awareness in the community and providing practical coping mechanisms and strategies to high school students.

Since completing the restrooms in May, we have been able to hold two craft fairs, the county fair, and two weddings. Everyone was thrilled to have functional restrooms within the building. With your generous grant we have also purchased and placed security cameras around the outer perimeter of the building.

Grant Amount: \$5,041.91

Grant Purpose: Advanced 3D classes were able to create pottery and explore alternative firing methods. Students completed advanced throwing techniques as well as Horse Hair, Raku, and Saggar firing techniques. Twenty advanced artists challenged themselves to try these new techniques and accept failure in order to improve. This project and grant have raised the level of quality and quantity of artwork in the program at South Newton. Students created 50 pieces for the alternative firing process and helped to effectively increase enrollment for the ceramics and advanced 3D classes next year. During this process, the students provided demonstrations to beginning ceramics students, Mrs. Cripe's 3rd Grade class, and the high school student body. Thank you to the Jasper Newton Foundation and South Newton School Corporation for their support and encouragement.



LINCOLN TOWNSHIP PARK WALKING PATH

ROSELAWN LITTLE LEAGUE

Funded By: Newton County Community Fund

Grant Amount: \$52,848

Grant Purpose: The Roselawn Little League Board noticed that when members of the community wanted to go out to walk, run, or ride bikes, the only places to do so were either in the street or on gravel roads. In order to address this issue and to enhance their playing fields, a half mile long walking path was constructed in the area. Many utilize the path daily and thoroughly enjoy everything it has to offer. The path serves to promote health and fitness in the community by creating easy access to a safe place to partake in outdoor exercise activities.



UP TO \$325,000 THROUGH 2025 FOR THE INITIAL GRANT PHASE.

In 2021, we had a generous donor designate Jasper Newton Foundation as the beneficiary of an IRA upon their passing. The gift of \$2.6 Million to the Foundation is the second largest gift to JNF since its beginnings in 1991. This donor had a "true North" sense of what they wanted to do with the rewards of their life's work - and that was to help other people who needed a second chance at life.

INF does not handle social services - we fund nonprofit organizations to execute those missions. It took a while, but we found a fantastic program through United Way of Northwest Indiana called "Level Up" that fit the mission of the Second Chance Fund and served the very individuals that our generous donor wanted to help. A partnership with United Way was formed and with funding from the Second Chance Fund - we will be providing an opportunity for our community

members - our neighbors - who are ready for a second chance - to level up and THRIVE in Jasper and Newton Counties.

The Level Up Program is a financial stability program for working families in an area that includes Jasper and Newton Counties. The program is flexible to meet client needs. The program is designed to be completed between 12 to 18 months, depending on client circumstances. Learning opportunities include soft skills training, financial education training, trade/certification training, job connection, employment and retention guidance, and financial and socialemotional assistance to eliminate barriers.

In 2022, this grant fund was able to secure a Community Resource Advocate for Jasper and Newton Counties and start getting local residents who qualify, connected with the Level Up program.









THE HEALTHY YOUTH PARKS EDUCATION RECREATION CENTER, OR HYPER CENTER, IS AN INDOOR/OUTDOOR SPACE ON THE CAMPUS OF BROOKSIDE PARK UNDER THE DIRECTION OF HEATHER HALL.

Its purpose is to provide opportunities in education and recreation to our community with a special emphasis on youth. Through these programs, community youth will develop a sense of place by exploring the natural world, immersing themselves in a variety of leisure activities (swimming, archery, disc golf, etc.), and learning life skills such as maintaining a garden and preparing food. All of this is done by tapping into the expertise of HYPER staff, local experts, and community volunteers.

At the heart of this center is the creation of a space that will make positive community interactions possible. This space has much to offer the youth of our community. Nearby is The Jeff Goad HYPER Center Classroom, a multipurpose hub for park camps, classes, clubs, and more. In time, the HYPER Center will also include a Youth Community Garden where produce will be grown and donated locally. In 2022, the HYPER Center utilized funds from the Rensselaer Parks Fund and other donors.


